All the activities are delivered by qualified and experienced outdoor education workers.

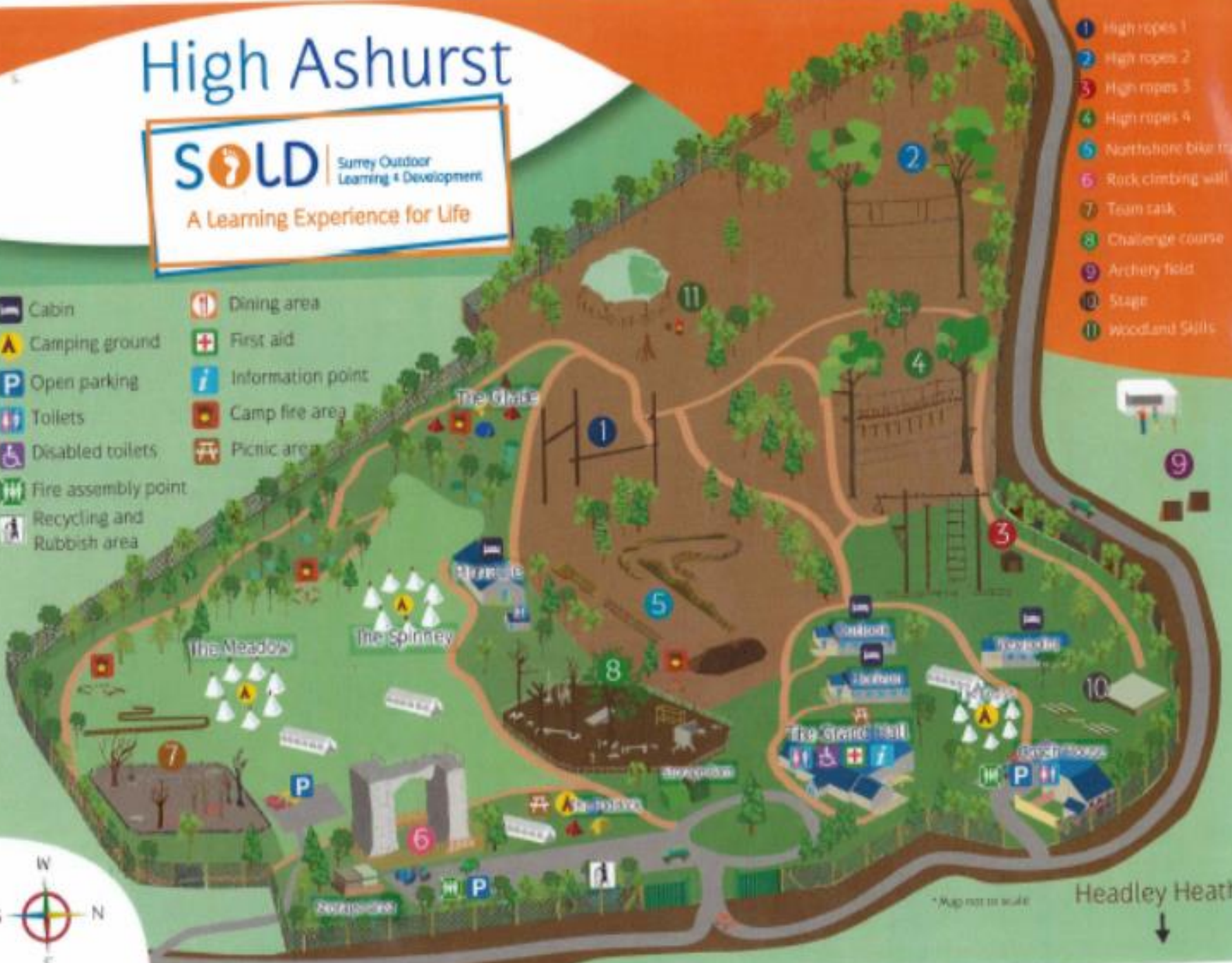

Deluxe Log Cabins

The log cabins each sleep up to 20 children (with two group leaders) in six bedrooms. Each bedroom has an en-suite bathroom.

Bedrooms are furnished with comfortable wooden bunk beds and a z-bed. Linen (duvet) for the beds is provided but children do have to make their own bed when they arrive.



There is a spacious living room where the children can chill out on the sofas to plan for the day ahead, or relax after their fun day at High Ashurst.

Children will eat all meals in the main hall.

Breakfast is a full English breakfast with cereals and toast available.

Lunch is a packed lunch everyday with sandwiches, crisps, fruit, cake/biscuits

Dinner will always have 3 or 4 options and a salad bar so there is plenty of choice, pudding or cheese and biscuits.

The kitchen is nut free and will deal with any food intolerances/allergies or other dietary needs, such as vegetarianism and halal requirements are catered for.

The kitchen will be aware of any dietary issues you have told us about on your health forms.
