Key Vocabulary

Pound (£)	A unit of money used in the UK. It is represented by the symbol £. One UK pound is divided into a hundred pence.
Penny (p)	A penny is one hundredth of a pound, or a coin worth this amount of money.
Pence (p)	Plural of penny.
Decimal	This is a way of writing a number that is not a whole. Decimal numbers are 'in between' numbers.
Decimal point	The dot used to separate the whole part of a number from the fractional part of a number.
Estimate	To make an approximate judgment or calculation of it.
Overestimate	to value or estimate too highly
Underestimate	to make too low an estimate
Approximately	close to; around; roughly or in the region of

What will I know by the end of the unit?

How many pence make a 1 pound?	100p
Why do we write a decimal point between the pounds and pence?	To separate the pounds and the pence.
What calculation do you use when you convert from pounds to pence?	Multiply by 100
What calculation do you use when you convert from pence to pounds?	Divide by 100
Convert 343p into pounds and pence.	£3.43
Convert £7.53 into pence.	753P
Round £5.63 to the nearest pound.	£6
