...progress?

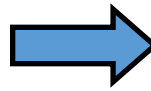
...classroom issues?

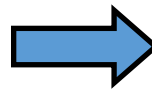

Speak with our Home School Link Worker—Karen Burgess to see how we can help.

Your child may need support from our ELSA's (Emotional Literacy Support Assistants) Mrs Baker. This may involve social and emotional focus groups to encourage children to express their feelings, resolve concerns and develop coping strategies.

If your child requires support that is more specific a referral may be made to Learning Space or CAMHS
