Uniform Expectations

Please ensure your children are wearing the correct uniform and that they are not wearing necklaces or bracelets to school. Shoes need to be black on non-uniform days. If children have **plain black** trainers (with black or dark soles), they may wear these throughout the week for the rest of summer term. This avoids you having to replace expensive school shoes.

For days the children have PE, they should wear plain navy jogging bottoms or shorts.

In line with our uniform policy, we ask that all PE wear is loose-fitting.
